## MAKING FOOD ALLERGEN MANAGEMENT TRAINING ACCESSIBLE TO MULTIPLE SECTORS

## Introduction

Since 2017 the National Allergy Strategy (NAS) has worked with different sectors to develop a series of free and engaging online food allergy training course for staff working in food service.

## Results

Total course enrolments (Jul 20-Jun21) were 28,468 noting the Hospitals, Schools and CEC courses were only recently added. All about Allergens alone receives 1000 enrolments per month.

Evaluation indicates that the courses are meeting the needs of participants, are easy to understand with high satisfaction rates for content (99%) and length (94%).

## Conclusion

The All about Allergens online training provides access to nationally standardised food allergy education that is free and accessible. It reinforces the NAS food service project messaging that managing food allergies is everyone's responsibility.
